

In the winter months identifying trees means assessing the character and presence (or absence) of leaves and growth habitat. Homeowners will be interested in its size at maturity, shape, and bark features; and should consider whether it is native or non native to North America.

Legend used here:

- multiple specimens of this type on trail **Deciduous** ~ lose their leaves in winter **Evergreen** ~ retain; mostly needle-like differentiated by length, number, and arrangement in the bundle; presence of pinecones (or not)

N/NN= *Native* or *non-native* (Country of origin, if known)



Rockledge Golf Club Winter Trails

- Yellow Trail (0.6 mi.)



- **Red Trail** (1.6 mi.)



- Blue Trail (2.2 mi.)

All three trails start at the Rockledge Pro Shop

The Yellow Trail (0.6 mi.) will lead you to the most interesting and unusual trees that thrive in New England. The trail starts at the Rockledge Pro Shop and is clearly marked with colored markers, spaced .1 mile apart- so following the trail is safe and easy. The Yellow Trail at the Rockledge Golf Club is the perfect place for learning about the different varieties of trees in New England.

Trail Guidelines



- Park only in the Rockledge Golf Club parking lot adjacent to South Main Street.
- Trails are open from dawn to dusk, every day including holidays.
- Stay on the designated trails to avoid hazardous areas and prevent damage to the greens and tees.
- Bicycles, snowmobiles, ATV's and motorized vehicles of any kind are not allowed.
- Dogs are welcome- but must be leashed and cleaned up after. All waste must be bagged and removed from the area
- Please- leave no trace behind....except your footprints



The trees are identified with metal plates affixed to them and listed herein in approximate order from where first seen on the yellow trail at the south side rear of the Clubhouse, proceeding west and back around to the north of where the trail began.
